Competition – Saturday, June 19. Competitors can arrive at 7 a.m. to warm-up. First event warm-up at 8:30 a.m. Event starts at 9 a.m.

**--COMPETITION DESCRIPTIONS--**

Eligibility: Open to all GRPA, GHSA, USA Diving members or other interested individuals.

Rules:

(a) Governed by United States Diving.

Facilities:

(a) Two – 1 Meter & One – 3 Meter

Dives for Competition (Level 1):

- (a) 7-U\* – All divers shall perform, on one meter, a front jump (100 D) and a back jump (200 D), using a DD of 1.0. These two jumps or entries shall be done in any order at beginning of the competition and shall be followed by three dives from at least two different groups, using a true DD.
- (b) 9-U \* – All divers shall perform, on one meter, a forward jump (100 D) and a backward jump (200 D), using a DD of 1.0. On three meter, all divers shall perform a front jump (100 D) and a front entry (001), using a DD of 1.0. These two jumps or entries shall be done in any order at beginning of the competition and shall be followed by three dives from at least two different groups, using a true DD.
- (c) 10-11\* – All divers shall perform, on one meter, a forward jump (100 D) and a backward jump (200 D), using a DD of 1.0. On three, all divers shall perform a front jump (100 D) and a front entry (001), using a DD of 1.0. These two jumps or entries shall be done in any order at the beginning of the competition and shall be followed by three dives from at least two different groups, using a true DD.
- (d) 12-13 \* – All divers shall perform, on one meter, a forward jump (100 D) and a backward jump (200 D), using a DD of 1.0. On three meters, all divers shall perform a front jump (100 D) and a front entry (001), using a DD of 1.0. These two jumps or entries shall be done in any order at the beginning of the competition and shall be followed by dive 101 (D), using a DD of 1.8 on one meter and 1.9 on three meter, plus three optional dives from different groups. Any dive on the table may be used. The optional dives shall be calculated with their true DD.
- (e) 14-15, 16-18, 19 & Over\* – All divers shall perform, on one meter, a forward jump (100 D) and a backward jump (200 D), using a DD of 1.0. On three meter, all divers shall perform a front jump (100 D) and front entry (001), using a DD of 1.0. These two jumps or entries shall be done in any order at the beginning of the competition and shall be followed by five dives from at three different groups, with no more than two dives from any one group. Dives shall be calculated with their true DD.

Dives for Competition (Level 2): (Level 2 divers must be a US Diving member)

- (a) Governed by US Diving as listed in the 2001 US Diving Rules and Regulations rulebook. \*

#### Advance to Nationals –

**About the Georgia Games Championships** – The Georgia Games Championships is a sports festival created for Georgia's amateur athletes. Patterned after the Summer Olympics, the 2009 Championships will consist of 40 sports providing Georgia's amateur athletes, of all ages and skill levels, a meaningful opportunity to participate in a true amateur sport competition.

**Who Can Compete** – All residents of Georgia who have lived in the state for at least 30 days prior to the date of competition for their sport are eligible if they meet the requirements specified by that sport. Georgia residents attending school or serving in the military in other states are also eligible. Residents of South Carolina and Tennessee are invited to participate as well.

**How To Enter – NEW ONLINE REGISTRATION!** Visit our website [www.georgiagames.org](http://www.georgiagames.org) to register online and receive a discount. Entry forms may be obtained by visiting our web site or by calling 770-528-3580. Participants are encouraged to note deadlines and register early for all competitions. A signed agreement, release and waiver of liability and payment of an entry fee is required in order to compete.

#### Refund Policy – REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES *ONLY*:

- Entry received after maximum numbers of teams or individuals are bracketed.
- Insufficient number of teams or individuals entered.
- Entry received from a non-qualified athlete.

**Insurance – Insurance is the responsibility of each participant.** In some instances, the National Governing Body (NGB), which sanctions an event, may have secondary coverage. Medical aid will be available in the event of an emergency, injury or illness. Preparation for competition, such as taping, will not be provided.

**Governing Body Registration/Membership** – NGB registration requirements vary between sports. Please check your sport event information for details.

**Number of Sports Entered** - You may enter as many sports as you wish, as long as the events are not held at conflicting times. It is the athlete's responsibility to make sure there are no schedule conflicts in the sports he/she enters.

**Awards** – All participants will receive an official Georgia Games Championships commemorative T-shirt. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the first three places. With the inclusion of out-of-state athletes, no Georgian will be displaced for a medal. See your Event Director with any questions regarding this information. The Georgia Games Sportsmanship Award will be presented to the male and female in each sport who best exemplifies the positive attributes of a model competitor. Additionally, one male and one female athlete from the pool of Sportsmanship Award winners will be nominated for the State Games Athlete of the Year Award.

**Organizers** – The Georgia Games staff, assisted by thousands of volunteers, carry out the various tasks associated with the execution of the Georgia Games Championships.
